Looking back on 2025, I am filled with gratitude for the community that makes the Community Resource Center of Stanwood-Camano possible. This year brought growth, new opportunities, and countless moments of connection—and through it all, our commitment remained the same: building a healthier, stronger, and more connected community.

Throughout the year, the CRC continued to be a place where people could find support, build relationships, learn, and belong. From resource navigation and basic needs assistance to early learning, teen programs, and community events, we worked to meet people where they were and help them take their next step forward.

One of our biggest milestones was the opening of the Little Green House Resource Hub across the street from the CRC. This new space has expanded access to resources, basic needs support, and visiting community agencies while creating another welcoming place for our neighbors to connect.

Our programs also continued to grow. Dottie's Garden provided children and families with opportunities to learn and explore outdoors, while our teen programs gave young people space to create, lead, build relationships, and find their voices.

The CRC served 574 teens in the SC School District. 93% of the teens have increased protective factors. 72% have an increase in sense of empowerment. 87% expressed feeling less isolated.

2357 individuals were provided with basic necessities such as gas vouchers, propane, financial assistance for utilities and case management.

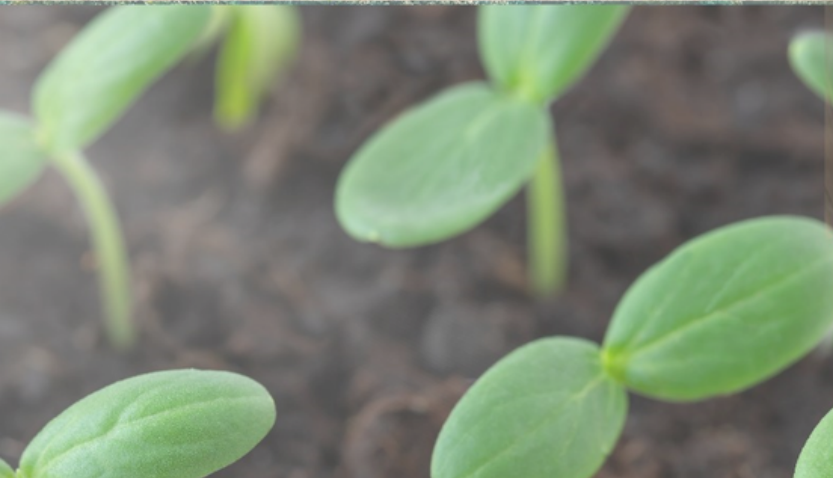
We have helped serve over 6700 individuals in the Stanwood Camano area during community events and programs that bring people together and provide connection, belonging, and opportunities for lifelong learning.



Out of the 755 families participating in early learning programs, 83% of families feel they have improved their parenting skills, improving family resiliency. 93% of families developed new relationships and are more engaged in community.



CRC Volunteers donated over 1500 hours of volunteer time to essential functions of the CRC including operations, events, DD services, and board direction.
